II. INFORMATION ABOUT OUR DISTRICT

The Coal City Public Library District is located in the eastern portion of Grundy County, Illinois. The Village of Coal City is in close proximity to two other unincorporated villages, Diamond and Carbon Hill, and to an unincorporated area, Goose Lake. The Library District is substantially larger than the Village of Coal City. The Library District includes all of Felix Township, most of Braceville Township and portions of Aux Sable, Goose Lake, Maine, and Wauponsee Townships. There are four libraries in Grundy County. They are as follows: Coal City Public Library District, Fossil Ridge Library District, Morris Area Public Library and Three Rivers Library District. The population of our Library District is 11,524 as of the 2020 Census. The Library has 25 employees.

Our annual budget for FY23-24 is \$1,575,457.00. The Library's equalized assess valuation (EAV) for 2023 is 918,708,345.

• TIMELINE AND SERVICES DURING COVID

March 16, 2020:

- The Trump administration's coronavirus task force announced strict new guidelines in an effort to restrict the spread of COVID-19. The new guideline that effected the Library was that Americans should not gather in groups of more than 10 people.
- We announced we would close from March 17th through March 31st. The
 decision to close the Library did not come easily. But there was never a
 complete shut-down of services.

March 17, 2020:

- O We announced:
 - All checked out materials would have and extended check out date of April 7th.
 - Restrictions on items that could be placed in the book-drops were lifted so patrons could return items when they no longer needed them.
 - In an effort to assist students with virtual classes we asked the Schools to send a blast to all students that we had hotspots and laptops for checkout.

March 18, 2020:

- We mailed a flyer to every household in the District advising them of the following:
 - Hoopla checkouts were increased from five to 20.

- Outdoor programs patrons who remain six feet apart don't have to wear face coverings.
- Outdoor Movies are presented for patrons.
- Exercise classes return with limited capacity.

May, 2021

Social distancing requirements are removed.

The Library was Fine Free for Quarantine.

NEW GOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENTS

- Village of Coal City Health insurance; Coal City Tax Increment Financing
 District; Garbage pickup. The Library purchases health insurance through the
 Village of Coal City saving both entities money through the economies of
 scale. The Village included Library property in the TIF District, in the future
 the Library could be eligible for TIF fund distributions. The Village included
 the Library in their garbage pickup bid saving the Library money.
- Coal City Community Unit #1 School District, Grundy County, Coal City Fire
 Protection District, Gooselake Township, Gooselake Township Road District
 and Joliet Junior College Redistribution of the Dresden Nuclear Generating
 Station Annual Credit Trigger Amounts; For the Negotiation and/or Litigation
 of Property Tax Issues Related to the Ge-Hitachi Nuclear Energy Morris
 Operation Owned by Ge-Hitachi Nuclear Energy LLC. These IGA's allow all
 the taxing bodies to work together to negotiate tax revenue that considers the
 needs of all the taxing bodies.
- In 2020 Census population increased from 11,257 to 11,524.
- Increases from Pre-COVID (FY18-19) to last fiscal year (FY22-23) include:
 - o Annual door count increased 27%.
 - o Passive Programs increased 147%.
 - Passive Program attendance increased 47%.
 - o Study Room usage increased 133%.
 - o Service usage increased 273%.
